

VOWEL TUNING CHART

Ah - Father
Uh - Mother
OO - Foot
Oh - Foe
oo - Food

ah - Cat
eh - Ed
a - Play
ih - It

EE - Feed

I - Pride

NOTE: The "I" is a diphthong, "ah" > "ee". As you approach the 1st bridge there must be a movement towards "uh" > "ee" to prevent the "I" from being too broad and losing the vocal line.

Ah > Uh > OO (Foot) > Oh (Foe) > oo (food)

ah (cat) > eh (ed) > ih (it)

A (Plate) sung as if EE (Please)

NOTE: The "A" as in "Plate" should be sung in an "EE" as in "Please" position. As if with an Irish brogue.

NOTE: When singing an "EE" as in "Please" and ascending the scale, you must add a little "ih" so you don't squeeze the "ee" vowel.

When singing an "OH" as in "Foe", put it in the "oo" as in "Food" position if it's going too broad.
